MINUTES Daily Briefing August 11, 2016

Greene County Commission Office 9:30 a.m.

Two documents were submitted and are attached herein as Exhibit A and Exhibit B.

Presiding Commissioner Bob Cirtin called the meeting of August 11, 2016 to order.

Roll Call – Upon roll call the following Commissioners were present:

<u>Items for Consideration and Action by the Commission</u>

Temporary Jail Bid—Chris Mericle

Chris reported that one vendor was present for the bid opening. Chris Mericle reviewed the cost of the project based on the one vendor's submission (Exhibit A). The options for the Commission to consider are ownership outright vs. maintenance by the vendor on the construction of a temporary jail structure. The Commissioners stated they will not take action on outright ownership of the proposed temporary jail.

Jeff Scott explained the initial lease numbers and cost.

Commissioner Cirtin moved to reject the bid in its entirety for the construction of the Greene County temporary jail. Commissioner Bengsch seconded the motion and it unanimously failed.

Chris Mericle went over numbers for an option to purchase the temporary jail structure (Exhibit B).

Commissioner Bengsch moved to reject the offer of purchasing the temporary jail structure. Commissioner Cirtin seconded the motion and it unanimously failed.

Chris Mericle stated the county has the option to rebid and revise the wall height to be shorter in hopes to attract more vendors. There was a discussion of the number of inmates and the cost of the structure. Chris Mericle offered to explore optional ceiling height of a temporary jail. The Commission agreed.

Informational Items

Juvenile—Bill Prince

Bill gave a staff update indicating there is one vacancy for a secretary at a grade six.

Bill stated Juvenile is working with local universities for programs such as music therapy. Bill stated the Juvenile Department has worked with Drury University volunteer students who have painted walls at the Juvenile building.

Bill invited the Commission to Juvenile's annual picnic on August 30, 2016, at Phelps Grove Park from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Live music will be featured.

Dave Dunn has been to Juvenile review at the security of the building.

Bill reported that Juvenile is working with Jefferson City regarding the relative rate index. The department is looking at repeat offenders that inflate numbers for detention.

Jennifer introduced Sheena Elzie, reporter with Springfield KSPR News Station. Jennifer gave an update on media stories.
