RE: Request for Grant Consideration from Reserve Funds

Thank you to the Commission for the worthwhile opportunity to award \$4.6 million to 25 Greene County public and private schools and educational agencies. The feedback we have received from the recipients makes us grateful to support these groups during this unprecedented time.

Despite the impact that \$4.6 million made, due to some late requests, we found ourselves having to make some difficult choices on two grants. One we used our remaining balance to partially support, and the other we left on the table, hoping to ask for support from the commission by using some of the 10% hold-back to award these requests.

Grant # 658, Cox College of Nursing – their request for technology to better facilitate virtual learning for nursing students in multiple classrooms, was for the amount of \$122,863. At the time we received the grant, our balance available was \$38,551.31 to award to their request. This leaves an unfilled request of \$84,311.87. We respectfully request that the Commission award this amount from their \$3.4 million set-back.

Grant #739, Legacy Learning Academy, a private pre-school and daycare facility, requested \$30,000 to reimburse for funds expended from last spring, and an additional \$108,000 for operating funds through November. While the committee felt that for the size of the facility, the grant request was somewhat excessive, we felt that an award request to the Commission of \$30,000 would be a reasonable award to support some of their unforeseen expenses of cleaning and safety measures. We respectfully request the Commission award \$30,000 toward this grant from their \$3.4 million set-back.

Thank you for your consideration of these two grant requests, and thank you for the opportunity to serve the educational community of Greene County.
