Greene County Commission signs and adopts 2024 budget



SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – The Greene County Commission signed and officially adopted the 2024 county budget on Wednesday, Jan. 10, in the county's Historic Courthouse in Springfield. This completes the public process which included 11 public meetings. The Commission focused on employee retention and recruitment, public safety, and quality core public services in 2024. The following are highlights and key takeaways of the appropriated budget.

- 4.5% cost of living adjustment (COLA) for all county employees and a mid-year merit step for eligible employees
- \$1.7 million for all Sheriff's Office commissioned officers to receive a \$2 an hour pay increase

- Up to \$5.9 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocations for community projects and campus preservations, such as window replacements in the county's Historic Courthouse
- \$3.1 million increase in county bridge replacement projects and \$2 million reduction in new road construction
- Created a new pay grade ladder for First and Senior Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys (APA) and adjusted overall APA salaries
- 31st Circuit Court will add one new position to their staff and the county's Juvenile Office will add two new positions along with receiving additional grants. These are the only new positions added to the county in 2024
- County Clerk's operational costs increased due to the 2024 presidential election

Budget Analysis

The total expenditure for all funds is \$284,632,952. State law requires county budgets to include prior-year surplus funds as revenue and be a balanced budget. The figures below show the estimated current revenues, but not total revenues, and appropriated expenses for the 2024 General Revenue (GR) fund.

\$18,175,000 will be allocated to Reserves. The Commission set certain budget priorities in cooperation with county Officeholders and department managers, however, could not accommodate \$6,995,201.89 of additional requests in the 2024 budget.

"In this year's budget process, the Commission, in collaboration with various county leaders and judicial representatives, faced the challenge of a constrained fiscal environment. We navigated these complexities to formulate a budget that aligns with our county's priorities," stated Presiding Commissioner Bob Dixon. "Citizens should be reassured that every decision was made with a strategic view towards sustainable financial planning, considering the broader economic trends. This approach has enabled Greene County to uphold a stable and promising financial outlook, with a keen focus on the well-being of our county workforce."
