Contestants in the “Stake in the Outcome Challenge” presented their entries, and a winner was selected by today’s Huddle attendees.

We had two entries, one from the Juvenile Office and one from the Auditor’s Office. Both entries and scoreboards are very well done!

The challenge chosen by Juvenile for their office is to identify, address and improve the issue of security in the Juvenile building, especially certain areas of the building. The steps they will take are:

1. Identify security enhancements
2. Acquire quotes
3. Schedule installation
4. Update appropriate security clearance for staff
5. Communicate established security protocol with staff and non-staff visitors
6. Completion
