Big Mommas is under a lease, and pays monthly rent to operate their restaurant located in the Judicial Courts Facility. The monies received go in to both the General Fund and the Employee Appreciation Day Fund. No revenue is received from the farmer’s market, whose operators bring their goods for employees and taxpayers to purchase on Thursday mornings. Use of the old snack bar area in the Historic Courthouse is offered to the market operators as a convenience to employees, and to promote healthy eating.
