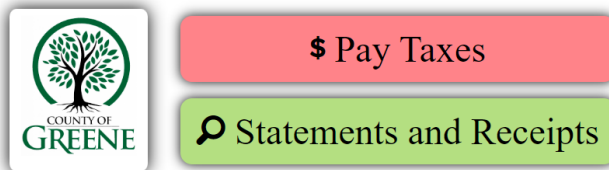
Greene County 2023 online tax statements now available

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Greene County personal property and real estate tax statements for 2023 are now available online for review and payment at www.CountyCollector.com.

There are four ways to pay the tax bill:

- Online at www.CountyCollector.com
- Bank check with a USPS postmark of Dec. 31, 2023 or earlier to avoid penalties
- In person in room 109 of the Greene County Historic Courthouse
- By phone at 888-523-0054

Taxpayers can find their unique Tax ID number and PIN by clicking on the green ‘Statements and Receipts’ button in the upper left corner of www.CountyCollector.com, or on a mailed statement at their home address.



The county Collector’s Office will send reminders to every email address on file which contains the tax amount due for 2023 and a citizen’s Tax ID number and PIN.

Tax statements will show their listed personal property, for example a vehicle, or real estate, for example a home, and show how much tax is owed by Dec. 31, 2023.

You can only search for one type of account (personal or real estate) by one type of criteria (name, tax id, address). After entering in search information, press ENTER or click the appropriate criteria button (has a magnifying glass symbol).

Taxpayers can pay both personal property and real estate taxes at the same time, as well as any late taxes from previous years. If more than one bill is due, the oldest must be paid before any others.

When paying online, there are no fees for using e-Check with a bank account number, but there's a 2% fee for credit cards and a 1.5% fee for debit cards.

When paying by phone, there's a 2% fee for any card and the service can only be used if all outstanding taxes have already been paid.

All personal property and real estate taxes must be paid before midnight on Dec. 31, 2023. Late payments will incur a 9% penalty and 2% interest charge.

If a taxpayer cannot find an online personal property or real estate tax statement for 2023, or has a question about the tax amount, they will need to contact the Greene County Assessor's Office, at 417-868-4101 or email assessoronline@greencountymo.gov, to have their property assessed to determine its value.

Greene County Collector Allen Icet anticipates mailed tax statements will be sent to homes by mid-November.

If a taxpayer has not received a mailed statement by Thanksgiving, please send an email to collectorhelp@greencountymo.gov.

Taxpayers can also pay their taxes by mail or in person at the Greene County Collector's Office located in room 109 of the Historic Courthouse located at 940 N Boonville Ave in Springfield.

The last day to pay in person is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 29, 2023.

If by mail, the envelope must be postmarked by Dec. 31, 2023 or else the payment will be considered late.

However, the easiest and most efficient way to pay county taxes is online at www.CountyCollector.com. There are no lines, no need for stamps and envelopes, and taxpayers will get an instant payment receipt.

Property tax revenue pays for entities like schools, roads, bridges, libraries, firefighters, and more. Your annual tax statement will have a breakdown of where the money goes and each taxing district's tax levy.

At the bottom of a tax statement, taxpayers can find answers to frequently asked questions about personal property or real estate taxes.

Follow the Greene County Collector of Revenue on Facebook, Instagram, or X (formerly known as Twitter) to receive the latest information on the tax process.

Citizens can also scan a QR code at any DMV office in Springfield that has additional tax information.

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Greene County is the State of Missouri's fourth most populous county, serving approximately 295,000 people.
