- 4) Identify the team
- 5) Set the time frame
- 6) Build the scoreboard
- 7) Establish non-monetary rewards (be creative!)
- 8) Share your progress
- 9) Play out the challenge
- 10) Celebrate the **WIN**!!

Each office that chooses to participate has until November 1<sup>st</sup> to submit their ideas and November 15<sup>th</sup> to create a scoreboard. The winner of the challenge will be presented with a goodie basket to share.
