There are three main programs provided: Community Based, Lunch Buddies and Mentoring 101.

Mentors are asked to be a positive adult role model; be consistent; focus on the 1:1 relationship (don't sit with other matches or children); take interest in your Little's life, stories, and hobbies; have fun together; and commit to at least one year.
