Discussion:

The onset of winter weather has shifted to between 8:00-10:00 am. Changes to the forecast include higher levels of sleet and freezing rain in the wintery mix but overall accumulation totals have not changed. Freezing rain will become more likely throughout the day, peaking around 21:00. Temperatures are expected to reach a high of 29 today so melting will be kept to a minimum.

Travel Issues:

Impacts: The primary impact will be elevated surfaces and roadways during the afternoon/evening commute. Current road temperatures are below freezing. Plan on slippery roads and reduced visibilities.


