Discussion:

A few strong to severe storms are noted in the area late tonight into Wednesday. Tuesday night into Wednesday morning expect localized rainfall west of the Lake Ozark to Springfield to Branson line. Rainfall totals expected to be 1 - 1.5", although repeated rounds of heavy rainfall could produce localized flooding. Marginal risk of continued heavy rainfall Wednesday morning through Strong storm evening through most of Missouri. systems from the west bring gusty winds to the area, gusting from 35 to 40mph. Wednesday morning to afternoon there is a marginal to slight risk of severe thunderstorm activity with large hail and damaging winds, tornado activity cannot be ruled out at this time. Highest chance of severe thunderstorm activity are from the southeast of Branson to Rolla line.


Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area!

- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
