Discussion:

Strong to severe thunderstorms possible tonight with the best chances from midnight to 4 AM. Highest chances in counties along/west of I-49 and north of I-44. Chances gradually diminish to the east. Damaging wind gusts and large hail are the primary hazards with this system. Tornado chances are low but not zero. Thunderstorms are expected to gradually weaken as they push east into early AM.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area!
 "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around...don't drown!"
