#### Discussion:

Chances for showers and storms will develop this afternoon and evening across the area. Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible. Large hail to the size of quarters, damaging winds in excess of 60 mph and frequent lightning are the primary risks. Pockets of heavy rainfall may lead to localized flooding. Widespread flooding is not expected.

Heat index values may reach the middle 90s east of Springfield this afternoon.

#### **Citizen Action Statement:**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
  - "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
  - "Turn around...don't drown!"
