### Discussion

Widespread rain and thunderstorms are expected Sunday night into Monday morning. Damaging wind gusts and flooding potential look to be the primary hazards with this line of storms. The greatest threat for severe weather will be west of Interstate 49.

Several chances for thunderstorms will occur from Monday through the end of next work week. Repeated thunderstorms could lead to a risk for excessive rain and flooding.

### **Citizen Action Statement**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around...don't drown!"
