Discussion:

A strong storm system entering the area will bring heavy rainfall and flooding potential. Strong to severe storms will be noted throughout the region Monday into Monday night. Overall severe thunderstorm risk remains limited, while low risk continues to be variable for tornados, hail, and excessive winds. Heaviest potential for excessive rainfall and flooding will be south of I-44. Rainfall totals expected between $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ inches throughout Greene County.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area!
 - "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around...don't drown!"
