- > Positive Behavior Luncheon
 - ~Once a month students with 80% positive behavior get to have lunch in the cafeteria and make a craft
 - ~Volunteers help supervise the craft
 - ~11:00 a.m.-12:20 p.m.



Lunch Buddy

- Eat lunch with a student weekly
 - ~Background Check
 - ~30 minutes
 - ~Positive adult role Model
 - ~Model appropriate

Reading or Math Buddy

- Tutor a student in reading or math
 ~20-30 minutes once a week
 - ~Read or be read to ~Help with a math
 - concept, hands on practice, or fluency practice (x table)



School Store

- Give time: help with school store by organizing or collecting "Care Cash"
- Donations: toys, hygiene items, snacks, school supplies, or crafts students can "purchase"




Mentors

- ➤ Small groups
 - ~4-6 students
 - ~once a week, twice a month, or once a month
 - ~work on a hobby based project, focus on a topic, or play with them at recess.
