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## Case Flow Management

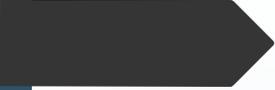
The particular way a court chooses to control the legal process by scheduling, arranging and conducting key procedural events while adhering to:

## Tools Used

### Cour Tools

Provides a court performance measurement through the use of monitoring analysis and management of results on a regular basis for the purpose of transparency, accountability, and continuous improvement.

## Cour Tool 1 - Access and Fairness

- Ratings of court users on the court's accessibility and its treatment of customers in terms of fairness, equality, and respect.
- Many assume it is about winning or losing. What matters most to citizens is how they are treated. Does the courts process appear to be fair.



## Cour Tool 2 – Clearance Rate

- The number of outgoing cases as a percentage of the number of incoming cases
- 1 or above is what a court should be striving for

## Cour Tool 3 – Time to Disposition

- The percentage of cases disposed or otherwise resolved within the establish time frames
- Factors impacting Time to Disposition
  - Court Operating Rule 17 on Time Standards
  - Type of case and number of litigants
  - Continuances
  - Motions for Change of Judge



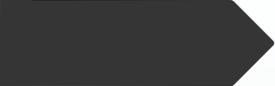
## Time Standards per Court Operating Rule 17

Circuit Civil	12 Months	24 Months	30 Months
Domestic Relations	4 Months	10 Months	14 Months
Associate Civil	4 Months	6 Months	12 Months
Circuit Felony	4 Months	10 Months	14 Months
Associate Criminal	3 Months	6 Months	8 Months

Time Standards do not apply to Juvenile, Probate or Mental Health proceedings, or to less serious general traffic offenses.



## Cour Tool 4 – Age of Pending Cases

The age of the active cases pending before the court, measured as the number of days from filing until the time of measurement.

## Cour Tool 5 - Trial Date Certainty

- The number of times cases are scheduled or disposed by before for trial date.
- One of the most difficult for the court to track. Currently we are able to track the number of continuances and by whom requested. However, we can not electronically track from the point of the date the trial was set. In the future, with changes to the court case management system, this measure should provide more beneficial data.



## Cour Tool 6 – Reliability and Integrity of Case Files

Percentage of case files which can be retrieved within the established time standards, and that meet established standards for completeness and accuracy of content.



## Cour Tool 7 - Collection of Monetary Penalties

- Payments are collected and disbursed within established time standards and meet established standards for completeness and accuracy.



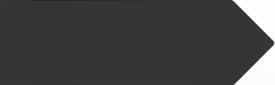
## Cour Tool 8 – Effective Use of Jurors

- The number of citizens who are selected for jury duty who are qualified and report to serve, expressed as a percentage of the total number of prospective jurors available. Juror utilization is the rate at which prospective jurors are used at least once in trial or Voir Dire.



## Cour Tool 9 – Court Employee Satisfaction

Use of a standard questionnaire which collects respondents' assignment for important court divisions (civil, criminal probate)



## Cour Tool 10 – Cost per Case

- Is a measure of the return (i.e. completed cases) on investment (resources allocated)
- Use in evaluating staff utilization
