

Focus Areas

Pathways out of Poverty

- We aim to break the cycle of generational poverty
- We help individuals and families become self-sufficient

Champion Children

 We work to ensure that all children have access to food, shelter and an education



Community Investment Process

- Community Investment Process was re-engineered in Spring 2022
 - We opened the funding process to new nonprofits/programs
 - Programs that apply for funding are moving the needle on creating pathways out of poverty or championing children (or both)



Community Investment Strategy

Undesignated dollars go into the Community Investment Fund

- New Community Investment Model
 - **Upstream** programs 60%
 - Safety Net programs 30%
 - Innovation fund 10% ("Shark Tank" competition)



Community Investment Process

Community Investment Process:

- Upstream, safety net, and innovation funding requests are submitted by nonprofits and reviewed by our Community Investment Panel (donor volunteers)
- The Community Investment Panel vets the nonprofits by looking at their financials and impact of each nonprofit/program
- The panel determines where dollars are allocated
- Programs are funded for two years but re-evaluated each year
