



Data Management

 - Youth data is consistent and complete involving all their services in the office.

Recidivism Study

- Technical Assistance recommended starting with measuring youth recidivism. (Dennis M. Mondoro) – John Tuell
- Goal
 - Year by Year Trends starting in 2017 when JOPS began.
- Includes overall rate and breakdowns in to court pathways (i.e., informal adjustments vs. formal probation)

Study Question

• What is the rate by which youth who had an experience with the juvenile office and received a service recidivate with an additional legally sufficient referral within one calendar year of their initial case closure?

Methodology

- Annual Entry Cohort all charges within a given year
- Unduplicate the data by individual youth

Recidivism Rate =

(number of youth that recidivated within 1 calendar year after case closure)

(total number of youth that received a service within the cohort)

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
