DISCUSSION

This morning at 4:18 AM CDT, 2 to 3 inches of rain have fallen across the James River basin over the last 24 hours. This has caused the James River to reach flood stage in East Springfield. Some locations that will experience flooding include Southeastern Springfield, Battlefield, Turners, and Galloway.

A line of storms will be ongoing across the area Friday morning. Damaging wind gusts and small hail will be possible with this activity. This line will slowly progress eastward and train, creating a flooding risk. Some redevelopment/intensification within this line is possible across south-central MO with the threat of damaging winds, hail up to the size of golf balls, and a tornado or two. A secondary threat for severe weather exists in extreme southeast Kansas late this afternoon into the early evening, extension into southwest Missouri is still contingent on energy return. If storms form, they will likely be quite isolated, but capable of producing hail up to the size of golf balls, damaging wind gusts, and potentially tornadoes.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
