County Commission's Role in Design/Construction of Buildings

- "Statute 49.470. County Commission may alter and repair county building, when."
- "Statute 49.510. County to provide and equip offices."
- "Statute 49.310. County Commission to erect and maintain courthouses, jails – issue bonds - certain counties authorized to maintain jails outside boundaries of county seat – courthouse with offices and court facilities, special rules."

County Commission's Role in Design/Construction of Buildings

- "Statute 49.400. County Commission to pay for building site, when."
- "Statute 49.330. Superintendent, appointment, compensation."
- "Statute 49.410. Plan of building to be submitted."
- "Statute 49.440. Superintendent to supervise work and report progress."

Who fills the role of the Superintendent/Project Manager?

- Resource Management under the County Commission
 - Resource Management Director Kevin Barnes (Previously Chris Coulter)
 - Design/Construction projects
 - Building Operations Director Franz Williams
 - Smaller projects that don't involve design consultants and involves his personnel and/or a specialty contractor
 - Project Manager Rob Rigdon
- We function as a representative of the Owner, working with the stakeholders/users of the buildings and spaces to meet their needs while ensuring that the costs are within budget and completed within any time constraints that are reasonably set.

We are all Project Managers

- We all have projects that we are trying to successfully complete.
- Some projects may be a solo effort and others a team effort.
- Many of us have had the experience of someone working on our house and what that entails
 - from evaluating a service or building contractor to making sure they complete the work to our satisfaction and the agreement

Project Manager Involvement and Responsibilities

- A project budget has to be established through the Budget Department and approved by County Commission
- "Soft Costs"
 - Costs to County not covered under construction contract
- Once a budget has been approved by the County Commission, the Project Manager is released to work with Purchasing to get an architect under contract, if one is needed.
 - Architect may have subconsultants

Project Manager involvement and responsibilities

- Project Delivery Methods:
 - Design Bid Build
 - Design Build
 - Construction Management Agent (CMA)
 - Construction Manager at Risk (CMaR)
 - Job Order Contracting (JOC)

Project Manager involvement and responsibilities

- Design review meetings with Stakeholders/End Users of Spaces being designed and built
- Working with Purchasing for RFQs, RFBs, contracts, and public advertisement of bids
- Review of Product Data and/or Shop Drawing submitted by the contractors

Administration of Construction Contract(s)

Owner Contingency, Construction Contingency, and Change Orders

- Primary Objective of Project Manager
 - Ensure that the County is receiving the best finished product within the approved budget within a timely manner





























