Overview of Events

- April 29 Storm: Severe straight-line winds caused widespread damage to structures, infrastructure and vegetation across Greene County.
- June 29 Storm: A second round of damaging storms struck less than two months later, compounding recovery efforts already underway.

Federal Stafford Act Declarations

Multi-layered:

Public Assistance:


- ✓ Local jurisdiction declares an emergency
- ✓ Damage assessment (2025=\$1.3 million changes annually)
- ✓ State declares an emergency
- ✓ FEMA & State Damage assessment (2025=\$13 million changes annually)
- ✓ FEMA Requests President to sign Stafford Act Declaration (75/25% reimbursement)

Federal Stafford Act Declarations


Multi-layered:

Individual Assistance:

- ✓ Local jurisdiction declares an emergency
- ✓ Damage assessment (no specific number requirements)
- ✓ State declares an emergency
- ✓ FEMA & State conducts damage assessment (no specific numbers, but we hear 200+ uninsured or under-insured homes/businesses damaged)



April 29 Storm Damages





April 29 Damages

- 75,000 lost power
- 272 Damage assessments completed:
 - 92 Affected
 - 74 Minor
 - 89 Major



• 17 Destroyed

April 29 Infrastructure Costs

- Highway Department:
 - ✓ Estimated costs- \$240,000+
- Utilities:
 - ✓ Estimated costs- \$12,000,000+




April 29 Federal Declarations

- FEMA Stafford Act-Public Assistance Declaration
 - ■75/25 % Matching Reimbursement
- SBA Declaration for Low Interest Loans



June 29 Storm Damages





June 29 Damages

- 50,000 lost power
- 221 Damage assessments completed:
 - 107 Affected
 - 62 Minor
 - 43 Major



• 9 Destroyed

June 29 Infrastructure Costs

Utilities:

✓ Estimated costs- \$8,000,000+



June 29 Federal Declarations

• This storm did not qualify for FEMA assistance; however, we did seek and feel confident we will receive an SBA declaration for low interest loans for residents and businesses.



Volunteer Support

- Volunteers logged more than 1200 hours supporting both storms, so far.
- Southern Baptist Disaster Relief served more than 5500 meals between the two storms.
