


·6 multi-purpose K9's


·10-hour shifts

·Providing 24/7 protection and response to the needs of our citizens, responding to an average of 46,000 calls for service annually.

Serving 678 Square Miles and nearly 308,000 citizens.

- **13 Deputies assigned to the Greene County Campus during traditional hours of operation. Maintaining order and safety to county employees and visiting citizens throughout seven facilities across the campus.**
- **Active Patrols**
- **Responding to calls for service.**
- **Screening patrons of the Judicial Facilities (averaging 175,000 individuals per year.)**
- **Over 500 phone reports annually and 56 arrests made in 2025.**

What is a Patrol Deputy?

“A person who is commissioned by an elected Sheriff to perform duties to preserve the safety of their designated jurisdiction. “



Training

- **Police Academy** – Minimum of 600 hours for certification.
- Criminal and civil law
- Traffic code
- Emergency Vehicle Operations
- Domestic Violence
- Impaired driving
- Mental Health Incidents
- Medical Aid
- Drug recognition and Impairment
- Weapons Qualification

- Field training- approximately four months.

- Medical emergencies
- Vehicle Accidents
- Violent Assaults / Weapons offenses
- Burglary/ Home Invasion
- Theft / Vandalism
- Unknown Situations



Traffic Enforcement



- Prevent Dangerous Hazards
 - Address Traffic Violations
 - Recover Stolen vehicles/property
 - Wanted fugitives

- Speed is a contributing factor of 42% of fatal crashes each year.


