County Administrator Chris Coulter gave an update on behalf of Resource Management Director Kevin Barnes, who was at a conference. He told the Commission that the Sheriff's Office transition team recently made a trip to Georgia to look at prisons with steel cells for a cost comparison to concrete cells, which is what Greene County currently had. He also gave updates on projects around campus. Additionally, Coulter gave the Commission an update on opioid crisis litigation, and said PIO Donna Barton is working with Cora Scott at the City of Springfield on a joint press release. The County would be entering into the litigation within the next month, he said.

Donna Barton told the Commission that she is looking into a social media management service. The lowest cost she found for the service was $\$ 19$ per month.

Deputy Auditor Angie Crews told the Commission that Greene County Youth Academy had its last buy down of funds for the year and all checks would need to be cut by the end of the month.
