1. Historic Courthouse Grant—Tina Phillips

- *Received \$100,000 in grant money, we budgeted & 89,720 to match (70/30).*
- *Will meet Tuesday, February 2 with county staff to prepare next steps.*
- *This grant will be announced at the Huddle.*

2. Resource Management—Kevin Barnes

- *Met with judges. They selected carpet and paint.*
- *Friday Kevin will host a scheduling meeting regarding judicial renovations.*
- *Still working on moving the Cox Tower work along; bidding to come soon.*
- *FEMA/SEMA sent a letter to announce a closing visit. Todd Tucker will be here for a workshop assessing damage probably on February 8 from 10:00-2:00. This will involve city and county entities and will take place both on site and in a classroom at PSC (Public Safety Center).*

3. Other Items

- *Presentation of complaints, provided stats chart.*
- *New software will help track complaints, be useful in public education (such as which violations are most common).*
- *Having the attorney available has helped to be taken seriously.*
- *Updates on notable complaint/violation cases.*
- *Commissioner Cirtin suggested reaching out to DOR (Department of Revenue) regarding unlicensed care dealers /"curb stoning".*
- *There has been a challenge in tracking subjects of returned certified mail. Commissioner Bengsch suggested that the Health Department might have tools for that. Commissioner Cirtin has offered to help through his investigation services.*
- *Seeking to develop a process to ticket for high weeds and grass. Kevin will make contact with County Council regarding this process.*
