Informational Items

- 1. Review of Bond Arbitrage Rebate Computation—Jeff Scott
 - Tax Qualified Bond explanation and the definition of "arbitrage". Listed qualifications of bonds and the benefit from, but not profit from, Qualified Bonds. The county needs a negative arbitrage—not a profit. The county can receive rebates from the IRS each year as long as we have a negative arbitrage.
 - Explained policy with sewer bonds. No consultant has been hired for sewer bonds. There is never a positive in sewer bond arbitrage.
 - Cindy Stein, Auditor, gave an update on the arbitrage report which occurs every five years.

2. Other Items

Camille Knowles:

- Reports that unemployment rate is low in Greene County. HR issue is having Greene
 County applications for employment unable to submit electronically. You are able to view
 and print on the application, but unable to submit directly once the form is complete.
- Camille explained the history of what has been available and the programs the county
 has and its limitations. The program EDEN, which the county already has, does not allow
 an applicant to attach a resume and gives many errors when attempting to complete an
 application on line.
- Mailyn Knight explained a new system that their department has researched called CIVIC-HR. This is more user friendly to the different county departments who would be able to access information directly. The Commission was given a written report of the system as well as a brief video presentation. Mailyn explained hiring and application statistics.
- The system is a cost of \$10,000.00 up front with a maintenance fee of \$6500.00 each year following. The cost can be dispersed over several years to better budget the expense.
- The Commissioners agree to pursue looking at funding a new system.
