- 1. Prayer—Commissioner Harold Bengsch
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. Approve Minutes from Previous Session

Commissioner Bentley made the motion to accept the minutes of the previous session as noted. Commissioner Bengsch gave the second. The vote resulted in 3 ayes in favor. Motion passed.

- 4. Chamber Economic Development Update—Ryan Mooney/Matt Morrow
 - Ms. Haymes filled in for Matt Morrow in giving the Chamber update.
 - The Chamber has seventeen active projects, 1700 jobs involved.
 - They have conducted 32 business visits and updated on their conference and team contacts.
 - Update on conversations in providing products for new and existing business owners.
 - Update on "Go CAPS" working on real world projects i.e. smoking rates with regard to medical health care.
 - They will add computer sciences to their program and videos are being developed for recruiting specific talent (i.e. doctors) to the area.
 - Kraft is going to the City Council for approval of Chapter 100 creating 109 jobs and investments.
- 5. Missouri Job Center Update—Mary Ann Rojas
 - Update on current unemployment rate—the lowest in years at 3.2%. Youth unemployment is in crisis stage with some areas as high as 16% for the age group of 16-24 years old. They are developing their summer youth program and can subsidize up to 12 weeks for up to \$12.00 per hour. Youth may be able to establish a career path through this program.
 - Roundtable beginning during next week's conference that will focus on construction, health care, manufacturing and information technology.
 - There will be a hiring event March 9, from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Cox Health.

Commissioner Bengsch asked what action they can take as the example of the recent closing of Ryan's Cafeteria. Employees were notified of job loss with a note on the door of the establishment.

• The Career Center has a rapid response team for closed businesses that employ 50 or more with support of counseling, finances, consulting, résumés and locating other positions.

10. Budget Office Report—Tina Phillips

- Tina reports from the Budget Office that sales tax is up 8.5%.
- Update on delinquent sewer bill letters that have been mailed in February. Payments are coming in.
- Projections will begin in again in April with an update each month.
- Update on Public Safety Grant and working on requirements to maintain compliance on grants.
- Historic Courthouse information being submitted regarding the grant for the roof project. Outlined possible cost/funding of this project through a grant. The Commission will continue to be informed of possible costs that the grant would not cover.
- Tina states the Budget Office will attend the Office of Emergency Management workshop on March 17.

11. Highway Department Report—Rick Artman

- Salt update. Due to the lack of snow events over the winter, there should be a good supply for next season.

- The department is developing a local exercise planning program.

- *OEM has assisted Walnut Grove with their emergency plan.*
- Media continues to grow at OEM.

 - a. Request Rezoning, Planning Board Case Number PB 1902, James Robert Horton ETAL, TR, applicant.

Rezone request from A-1, Agriculture to RR-1, Rural Residence District at 267 S. FR 197, Springfield to allow it to be divided into 2 tracts. Board recommended in favor 7-0 to allow with conditions as stated.

Surveyor, Rick Wilson was present to answer any questions.

Commissioner Cirtin called for anyone to speak in favor or opposition to the request. None were present.

Commissioner Bengsch made the motion to approve the rezoning request with conditions. Commissioner Bentley gave the second. The vote resulted in 3 ayes in favor. Motion passed.

b. Request Rezoning, Planning Board Case Number PB 1903, James Skinner, applicant.

Rezone request from A-1, Agriculture to A-R, Agriculture Residence District at 12219 W. FR 194, Billings to allow the applicant to divide the tract into two 5 acre tracts. Board recommended in favor 7-0 to allow with conditions as stated.
